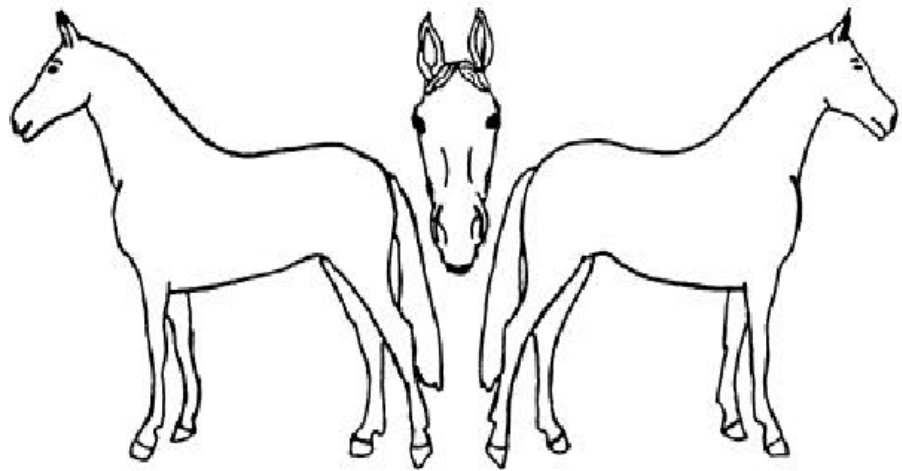

1. How to fill out and use this certificate:
  - A. Fill out one form for each horse, attach a photo of your horse, and submit to the Extension Office. A copy of the certificate will be returned to you once the county agent and horse superintendent sign the form.
  - B. Be sure all information is correct and all necessary signatures are included on both copies.
  - C. This certificate is a valuable record of your project animal. Keep it in a safe place.
  - D. You may be asked to present this certificate at county 4-H horse events.
  - E. At the end of the year, keep your copy in your record book.
2. 4-H members shall own or lease horses used in the 4-H horse project. Any 4-H horse must fulfill the following requirements:
  - A. Owned Horse: An owned horse should be identified by a 4-H ID certificate. Required certificates shall be completed and returned to the Carbon County Extension Office by **May 1** of the current year. Both the horse superintendent's and the county agent's signatures are required on the ID certificate.
  - B. Leased Horse: Any leased horse is to be leased for one full year and must be leased prior to May 1 of the current year.
  - C. Whenever a question about horse identification arises, the 4-H member is responsible for providing proper ownership proof.
  - D. Any infractions as determined by the county 4-H Horse Committee or County Fair Board will disqualify said horse during the contract year for showing or competing in any county or state 4-H contest.
  - E. A 4-H member can lease one horse if he already owns one horse.
  - F. A 4-H member cannot lease more than one horse under any circumstances.
3. Multiple use horses: A horse may be shared between immediate family members. However, the family members must exhibit this horse in separate classes. Exceptions may be approved through the Horse Committee.
4. The deadline for possession of an owned or leased horse is May 1.

**4-H Leader**

At a club meeting early in the new calendar year, instruct 4-H members on how to fill out the certificates and the importance of animal identification. Ask 4-H members to give speeches/demonstrations about animal identification and registration. Have 4-H members return their completed forms in time for you to sign them and send them to the Carbon County Extension Office for signature no later than May 1 of the current year.

**Extension Agent & Horse Superintendent**
